Sustainability in Industrial Design Workshop - October 6-15, 2017

The Industrial Design Collaboration with Reutlingen University in Germany offers industrial design students the unique opportunity to participate on multidisciplinary teams in a workshop focused on sustainability in design. This workshop will team Auburn students with students from Reutlingen on a 5-day challenge to better understand people's perceptions of sustainable materials relative to product design. This workshop will be led by two Auburn faculty members (Shea Tillman/TBA) and Dr. Martin Luccarelli of Reutlingen University, as part of the 2-credit hour AU course.

This ten-day trip will also include visiting sites of historical and industrial importance in design throughout the southern part of Germany (Stuttgart, Ulm, and Munich), known worldwide for its heritage of automotive production.

There are only 6 slots available for this workshop/study abroad opportunity, so please notify Shea know by July 10th if you plan to participate. DO NOT BOOK AIRFARE OR BEGIN APPLYING FOR VISAS YET! Shea will notify you when to begin doing this and we will coordinate together.

# travel documents
