## Aquaculture Production Class (FISH 5250/6250) at Can Tho University, Can Tho City, Vietnam

As part of a course screening process, all undergraduate and graduate students interested in participating in this course taught in Can Tho City, Vietnam from December 27, 2017-January 9, 2018 (possibly extended a few days) must submit an application. Only selected students will be eligible to take the class. Class size will most likely be limited to 10-15 students.

Selection of AU students will be competitive and follow Auburn Abroad program requirements (<a href="www.auburn.edu/studyabroad">www.auburn.edu/studyabroad</a>) through the Office of International Programs (OIP). All students MUST meet the following criteria:

- Must be junior, senior or graduate level
- Have successfully (C or higher for UG; B or higher for G) completed FISH 5210/6210 or have instructor approval
- Be at least 19 years old and possess a valid passport by start date, and
- Undergraduates must have a minimum GPA of 2.25 or higher.
- Transient student on Faculty-led Program: 2.50 minimum GPA
- Graduate Program abroad: 3.0 minimum institutional GPA
- Have no pending judicial actions/Good standing with university
- Student under 19 years of age must complete the Minor Age Paperwork and receive approval from the Provost. All forms on the Web.
- Have a valid passport
