

NEW COURSE FOR FALL 2017! POLI 6550: PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION, CIVIL SOCIETY, AND DEMOCRACY

Explore the relationships between public administration, civil society, and democracy in developing countries, using Liberia, West Africa as a case study. Over the course of the semester, students will examine Liberia's history and background, the capacity of democratic institutions, and the role of public administration and civil society in Liberia's development.

See democracy in action! A two-week study abroad experience in Liberia will coincide with Liberia's national presidential election on October 10, 2017, allowing students to participate in international election observation.

Students gain exposure to governance processes, democratic institutions, public administration systems and civil society through in-country interaction with civil servants, elected officials, members of civil society, development workers, academics, and citizens. The experience also provides opportunities to engage in field research, and participate in cultural activities.
